





Site Preparation Work in New Westminster

May 5, 2021

Over the coming months, Fraser Crossing Partners will continue site preparation work in New Westminster, including setting up fenced work areas and conducting investigative ground works within the alignment of the new bridge and roadways.

Fenced work areas will be used for storing materials, parking for site trailers, construction vehicles and crew, and providing access to other work sites in the area. While the work areas are being set up, trucks and construction equipment will be on site. These work areas will remain in place for the duration of the Project, and will be restored once construction is complete.

- Crews will first set up a fenced work area near Wellington Street and Dufferin Street. This area, where the new onramp will be constructed, will be closed permanently to traffic as part of this work.
- Crews will then set up a fenced work area within the grassy area bounded by the existing bridge approach, McBride Boulevard, Columbia Street, and Royal Avenue.

Investigative ground works are occurring throughout the Project construction area with crews hand shoveling and using auger drills as required. This work will take place in the following areas:

- South of Columbia Street, east of the existing bridge.
- West of the existing bridge approach near Wellington Street and Dufferin Street.
- Within the grassy area bounded by the existing bridge approach, McBride Boulevard, Columbia Street, and Royal Avenue.

What to Expect



Timing

Site preparation work will take place between May and August, 2021.

Work areas will remain in place for the duration of the Project.



Hours of Work

Monday to Friday from 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.



Traffic

When required, traffic control personnel will be on site to direct vehicle traffic, pedestrians, and cyclists. All traffic pattern changes will be well signed.



Impacts/Interruptions

Nearby residents will see crews on site and may hear some noise associated with on site vehicles and the use of auger drills during the investigative work.
