





In-river bridge foundation construction

July 6, 2023

Pile installation for the bridge foundation near the New Westminster shoreline (shown on page two) is complete and throughout the summer, crews will pour concrete and construct the columns at this foundation. Cranes and barges will be used to achieve this work. Crews will continue to use the temporary in-river access platform on the New Westminster side for marine construction at this foundation, similar to the one being used on the Surrey side as construction of the bridge tower continues.

Work on the bridge foundation on the New Wesminster side will involve:

- Placement of steel reinforcement and concrete
- Placement of rock for bridge foundation and riverbank protection

Soil densification work, which involves installation of timber piles, will also take place on the Surrey side of the river within the Project area.

This work is anticipated to start in July, subject to river conditions and in accordance with Fisheries and Oceans Canada requirements for minimizing impact to fish and fish habitat.

What to Expect



Timing

Starting in July and continuing into fall.



Hours of Work

The majority of the work will take place during the following hours:

Monday to Friday from 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m. Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m., and some Sundays from 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

Welding and other ancillary work on site will continue to occur at night.



Traffic

There will be short stoppages of traffic on Front Street to assist construction vehicles accessing the temporary inriver access platform. No other traffic impacts are anticipated.



Impacts/Interruptions

Nearby residents and businesses may hear some noise related to the work. Noise from soil densification work is not anticipated to impact residents or businesses.

Non-noisy work (welding and concrete work) will occur 24 hours a day, seven days a week.


