



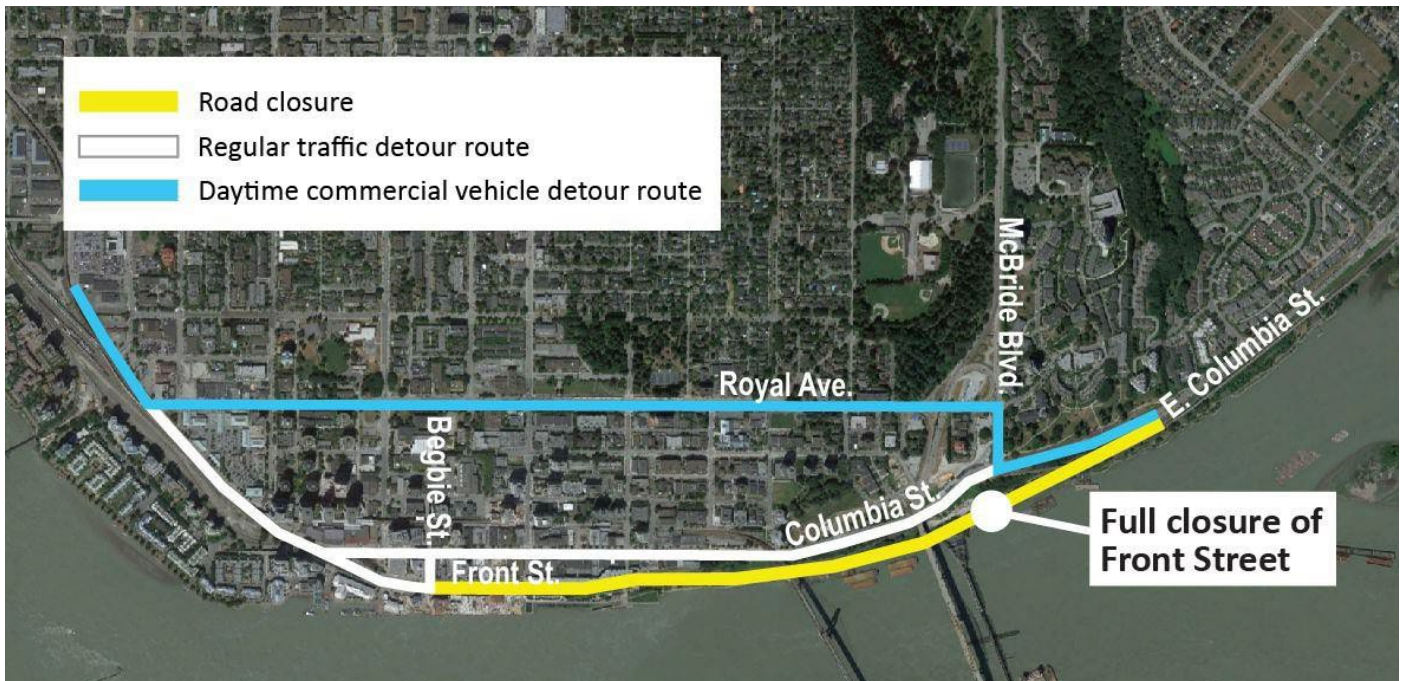
Six-month full closure of Front Street

June 3, 2024

Starting the week of June 17, Fraser Crossing Partners will implement a six-month full closure of Front Street between Begbie Street and E. Columbia Street. **Front Street Mews will remain open and access to businesses will be maintained.** This closure is required for crews to perform drainage work, install steel girders and build the new bridge deck across Front Street between the bridge foundation south of Columbia Street and the in-river foundation near the New Westminster shoreline.

While this full closure is in effect, drivers will be detoured to Columbia Street. Trucks will continue to use official truck routes based on applicable time restrictions, which include Royal Avenue and Braid Street/E 8th Avenue during the day and alternate routes at night. All traffic pattern changes and detours will be well signed, and traffic control personnel will be on site to direct traffic as required.

What to Expect



Timing

Starting the week of June 17 and continuing for approximately six months.



Hours of Work

Most work activities will take place Monday to Saturday. The full road closure will be in effect 24/7. As much as possible, noisy work activities will be completed during the day. Some non-noisy work activities will take place at night and on Sundays.



Traffic

Drivers will be detoured to Columbia Street. Front Street Mews will remain open. Trucks will be detoured to designated truck routes such as Royal Avenue and Braid Street/E 8th Avenue during the day. Alternatively, trucks may use 10th Avenue both day and night. Traffic control personnel will be on site to assist when necessary. All traffic pattern changes and detour routes will be well signed.



Impacts/Interruptions

Drivers may experience longer than normal travel times due to detours and higher traffic volumes. Nearby residents may hear some noise while girders are bolted into place. We appreciate your patience while this work is underway.
