



Traffic update for the *staləwəsəm* (Riverview) Bridge

January 2, 2026

Traffic is being switched to the *staləwəsəm* (Riverview) Bridge in phases to allow for completion of the tie-ins to existing roadways on either side.

At approximately 5 a.m. on Monday, January 5, the one northbound lane on the *staləwəsəm* (Riverview) Bridge will temporarily close. **All traffic will continue to use the Pattullo Bridge.**

Subsequent traffic phases will take place in January and involve various lane configurations, including a one-week closure of both bridges anticipated in mid to late January. This work is weather dependent, and specific dates will be communicated when they are confirmed.

What to Expect



Timing

At approximately 5 a.m. on Monday, January 5.



Hours of Work

Work activities will take place 24 hours a day. As much as possible, noisy activities will be completed during daytime hours.



Traffic

All drivers will be directed onto the Pattullo Bridge. All traffic pattern changes will be well-signed, and traffic control personnel will be on site to assist when required.



Impacts/Interruptions

Nearby residents may hear noise associated with construction activities.
