



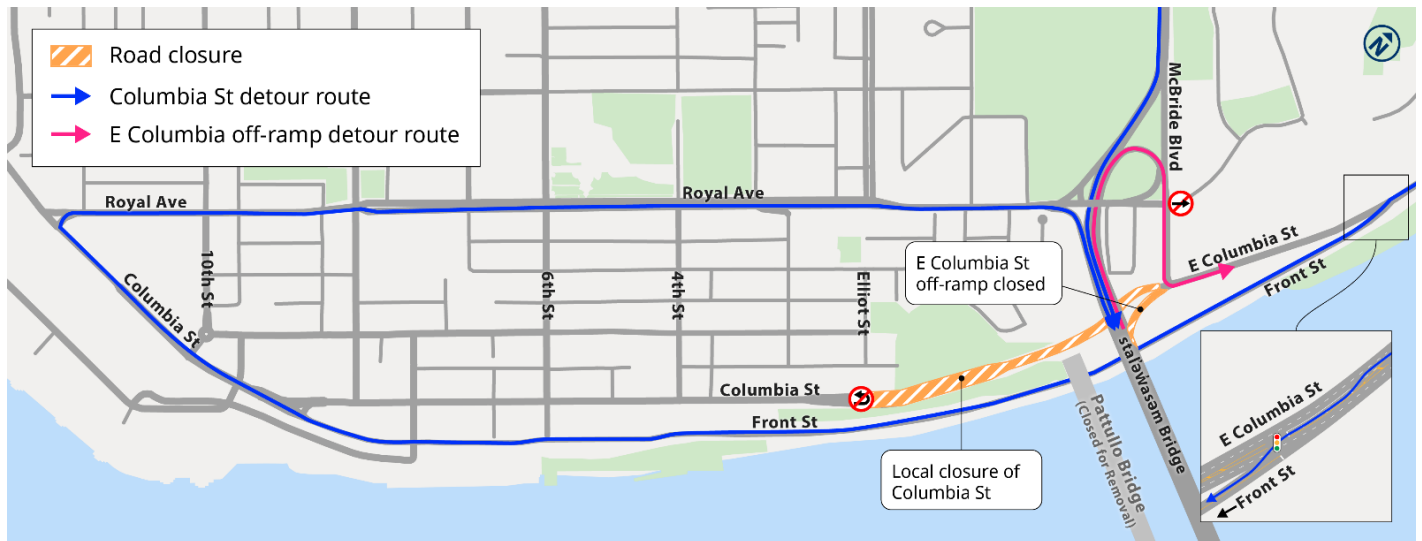
Overnight local closures of Columbia Street and the East Columbia off-ramp from the stal'əwasəm (Riverview) Bridge

May 8, 2026

Starting on Monday, May 11, overnight local closures of Columbia Street between McBride Boulevard and Elliot Street, and overnight closures of the East Columbia off-ramp, will be required for approximately two nights. These closures will support concrete pours on the new East Columbia multi-use path overpass.

Drivers will be detoured to Royal Avenue or Front Street. Southbound access to the stal'əwasəm Bridge continues to be maintained via McBride Boulevard and the Royal Avenue on-ramp. Drivers travelling northbound on the stal'əwasəm Bridge will be detoured to the Royal Avenue off-ramp on to McBride Boulevard to East Columbia Street (see map below for reference).

Columbia Street west of Elliot Street will remain open and **access to and from all businesses on Columbia Street and Front Street Mews will be maintained at all times**. All traffic pattern changes and detours will be well signed.

What to Expect



Timing

Starting Monday, May 11, for approximately two nights.

This work is weather dependent.



Hours of Work

Local Columbia Street closures:
9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

East Columbia off-ramp closures:
8 p.m. to 6 a.m.



Traffic

Drivers will be detoured to Royal Avenue or Front Street. Columbia Street west of Elliot Street will remain open. Commercial vehicles will be detoured to designated truck routes at all times. Drivers travelling northbound on the stal'əwəsəm Bridge will be detoured to the Royal Avenue off-ramp on to McBride Boulevard to East Columbia Street. All traffic pattern changes and detour routes will be well signed, and traffic control personnel will be on site to assist when required.



Impacts/Interruptions

Drivers may experience longer than normal travel times due to detours. Visit the Active Transportation webpage to learn more about pedestrian and cyclist access.

Nearby residents may hear some noise associated with construction activities.
